H-Games

This past Sunday Resident Life Programming held the year's first round of H Games. Representatives from Kauanoe, Ikena, Kehau and Kanilehua competed on various fronts to advance their hall's standing. The events were Volleyball, Dunk Tank, Striker, Slip-N-Slide, and Dodgeball.

Volleyball opened the day and allowed Kehau to take an early lead. Slip-N-Slide followed and turned out to be an intense race between Ikena and Kanilehua, who placed first and second, respectfully. Possibly the most memorable event, Dunk Tank, came next. Residents of all halls were allowed to take a shot at dunking Housing's own MC Faith Helenihi, among other dunkee's. The strong arms of Kauanoe earned the most points in Dunk Tank and placed first for the event with Ikena following close behind as second.

The next event, Striker, moved to a Sudden Victory round when Ikena and Kehau originally tied for first. In the Victory round Ikena pulled ahead of Kehau.

All of the events culminated in the following line-up for this round of H-Games: 1st Place—Kauanoe; 2nd Place—Ikena; 3rd Place—Kehau; 4th Place—Kanilehua.

There will be three more rounds of H-Games throughout the year; the next round happening this December. Residents of any hall can participate. At the end of the year the leading hall will receive a trophy and a plaque to honor their achievements.

UH-Chaminade Student Health Insurance Plan

Monday, September 15, 2008, is the last day to enroll in the UH-Chaminade Student Health Insurance Plan for the Fall 2008 semester (coverage for the Fall semester is from August 15 - December 31, 2008).

Current UH Chaminade Members: Due to the changes in plan options, all current UH-Chaminade student plan members (2007 - 2008) will be required to reapply for the UH-Chaminade Student Plan for the Fall 2008 semester. All members were cancelled from the plan effective August 15 and should have received a cancellation notice from HMSA. Don't return the cancel-

lation notice to HMSA! If you do that you will be asking them for information on HMSA's individual plans (medical only) and will no longer be associated with the UH-Chaminade Student Plan. If you wish to continue your UH-Chaminade Student insurance, please reapply by September 15, 2008 (application can be found online at www.hmsa.com/portal/student). There you will find information on eligibility, benefits, rates and instructions on how to enroll and pay either online or by mail.

Summer Storage

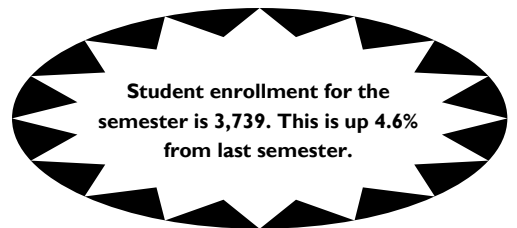
Registration

Every fall semester all bikes parked in housing must be registered. Bikes which were registered last semester need to be re-registered. The registration is free and

consists of a short application and proof of registration for Fall 2008/Spring 2009.

Bicycle Theft

In the past a number of bikes and bike parts have been stolen. Housing has recently improved the security in bike locations by installing better lighting around bike racks and changing several rack locations. Bike security, however, is not guaranteed. Remember to securely lock your bike up at all times with a high-quality locking device. Additionally, help others by reporting unusual activity (individuals with bolt cutters in bike areas, parts being removed while a bike is still on the rack, etc).

Residents need a CAT 5 Ethernet cable to access the internet in the rooms. Wireless access is available in many public locations and in a limited amount of rooms. 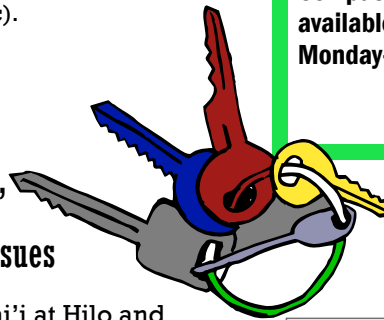
