The following list are items presented and or discussed at the Campus Center sponsored CSO Summit held Aug. 29<sup>th</sup> 2009 in Campus Center room 301.

- 1) The UH-Hilo fall 2009 enrollment as of 24-Aug-09 is 3,986 students
- 2) The Justifications that are now required to be part of all Request to Purchase (RTP) packets can be typed up on the back of the RTP form or put on a separate piece of paper. Each justification must be specific to the requested items.
- 3) Reminder after approval P-card purchases require at least 3 weeks to be processed before the purchase can be made.
- 4) Suggestion that the UHHS legislative committee could/should be looking into the possibility of making student fee funds exempt from State General Fund Restrictions .
- 5) Suggestion that the UHHS legislative committee could/should be looking into making inroads in regards to obtaining legislative approval for the physical expansion of campus center.
- 6) Is UHHS sponsoring or doing anything for Peace Day this year (Sept 20<sup>th</sup> )
- 7) Is UHHS still planning on running a senate candidate drive in November?
- 8) Reminder that Campus Center would like the involvement of all CSO's in Make a Differences Day on Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>.
- 9) If UHHS does not have any qualified candidates that meet all executive officer requirements-(specifically the constitutional requirement for executive officers listed in Article Two, Section B-4) that a memo to the chancellor requesting an exemption should be drafted. The requirement potentially needing exemption states:
  - a. "Nominees must have at least one (1) year experience as an officer for a University of Hawai'i system chartered student organization."
    - a. The Executive Senator is exempt from this clause
- 10) Campus Center has asked for a committee to be formed to write up a CSO code of ethics, Senators Akiona and Barnett both volunteered to assist.
